# Face coverings

From 8 August, you are legally obliged to wear a face covering in places of worship unless you are not able to put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment, or disability. Children under the age of 11 are also exempt.

If you do not have a face covering, disposable ones are available from the sides people and we ask that you make a contribution to church funds of at least £1.
